FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

A woman once came to Gandhi and asked him to please tell her son to give up his addiction to sugar. Gandhi asked the woman to bring the boy back in a week. Exactly one week later the woman returned, and Gandhi said to the boy, "Please give up eating sugar." The woman thanked the Mahatma, and, as she turned to go, asked him why he had not said those words a week ago." Gandhi replied, "Because a week ago, I had not given up my habit of eating sugar."

Jesus prepared himself for his ministry by a period of fasting, praying, and strengthening himself against temptation. How will we use the time of Lent for our spiritual training camp? Lent is a time to practice the use of God's word as our defensive weapon against temptation. What spiritual training plans will we put into practice during Lent? Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are traditional. Today's passage from the gospel might suggest that we spend a few minutes each day in reading Scripture. When we arm ourselves with WORD, the devil will have to run! Are we trying to live by "bread alone?"

Bible scholars interpret the graphic temptations of Jesus described by Matthew and Luke as a pictorial and dramatic representation of the inner struggle against a temptation that Jesus experienced throughout his public life. The devil was not trying to lure Jesus into some particular sin, rather, he was trying to entice Jesus away from his mission, mainly through a temptation to become the political messiah of Jewish expectations, and to use his divine power to avoid suffering and death. The opposition, hostility and rejection, which Jesus experienced, were constant temptations for him to use His power as God's Son to overcome evil. The temptation story depicts Jesus as obedient to his Father's will, refusing to be seduced into using his divine power or authority wrongly.

Like Jesus, every one of us is tempted to sinful pleasures, easy wealth and positions of authority, and is drawn to the use of unjust or sinful means to attain good ends. Jesus sets a model for conquering temptations through prayer, penance and the effective use of the "word of God." Temptations make us true warriors of God by strengthening our minds and hearts. We are never tempted beyond our power. In his first letter, St. John assures us: "*Greater is He who is in us, than the power of the world*"

Parish Council Minutes for 2/09/2010



Albert Domm called the meeting to order.

Fr. Davis offered the opening prayer

Open Actions

Religious Article Store

The Ladies Group informed the Council that they were onsite and would appear as necessary. The Council chose to have Jennifer Hultgren to first give her report on a location for and management of a Religious Article store. (See attached report for details.) Jeanette Sparkman presented the solution she proposed to the Ladies Council. She stated that she had no problem in converting the library into a store and relocating the furniture, books and articles now housed there to other sites.

Clare Keller reported that she had made the requested contact with St. Phillip's Bookstore and had attempted to make one with the Clarksville location but had not received a return call. The individual she spoke with at St. Phillip emphatically stated that before any attempt was made to start such a project the group should contact Frank Kruger, Financial Officer with the Nashville dioceses to ascertain what guidelines and/or regulations must be followed if any. St Phillips had learned from experience that there were certain existing policies that had to be satisfied.

At this point the representatives from the Ladies Group came in and answered some concerns of the council.

How will the store be funded? It will be self-sustaining.

Is it a business or a ministry? The ladies feel it is a ministry.

Had they attempted to speak with an official of the dioceses/ Ricki has spoken with someone at the Diocesan Office and is trying to work out the details for a meeting.

A lengthy discussion followed. It was decided they could continue with sales in the same manner in which they were already engaged until a decision was handed from the diocese. They were requested to present the details of the meeting to the Council. They were also requested to submit periodic operational reports to the council.

Narthex Facilities

Jennifer Hultgren submitted a detailed report on seating in the Narthex. (attachment for meeting).

Price reported that Ron Deal, Director of the Deaconate, Nashville Dioceses had visited and discouraged the use of additional seating in the Narthex based upon

Liturgical principles. He did suggest establishing a seating area for mothers with babies. Price will research the details of this recommendation.

A lengthy discussion followed and some rearranging of the Narthex furnishing will be attempted.

Ministry review update

This still is a work in progress. One final meeting will be scheduled in the near future to update all information.
