FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

Our culture has no shortage of masked heroes: Superman, Batman, Wonder Woman, Zorro and the Lone Ranger are but a few examples. Somehow, though, their "disguises" are closer to the reality of who they are and their "everyday" personas are masks that help them to understand us mere mortals. Superman, for example, really is an alien who has superhuman powers and uses them to help people. Clark Kent is just a way for him to get to know and get close to the people for whom he cares so much. Batman is truly a disturbed, tech-savvy crusader for justice; his alter ego is merely a socially acceptable disguise.

Today's Gospel "unmasks" a real hero: Jesus. His transfiguration and appearance alongside Moses and Elijah are far more representative of his true identity than his "disguise" of Galilean carpenter. Since Christianity is the majority religion in our culture, we tend to "domesticate" Jesus. We think of him as the humble, kind listener to our troubles, or perhaps the external, all-seeing conscience that looks down upon us from paintings and statues. The truth of who Jesus is is far beyond our comprehension. So, too, is the truth of who we truly are as Christians and members of the body of Christ.

The primary purpose of Jesus' transfiguration was to consult his heavenly Father and ascertain His plan for Our Lord's suffering, death and resurrection. The secondary aim was to make his chosen disciples aware of his divine glory so that they might discard their worldly ambitions about a conquering political Messiah and not to get discouraged at his suffering and humiliating death. The Transfiguration took place in late summer, just prior to the Feast of Tabernacles. Hence the Orthodox tradition celebrates the Transfiguration at about the time of the year when it actually occurred, in order to connect it with the Old Testament Feast of Tabernacles. The Western tradition normally celebrates the Feast of Transfiguration at the beginning of Lent.

We can share such experiences as those of Peter, James and John when we spend some extra time in prayer every day, talking to God and listening to Him. The meditative reading of the Bible daily enables us to hear God speaking to us and directing our lives as the three apostles experienced on the mountain of transfiguration. We have also other moments when we see and feel the glory of God surrounding us. Every Sunday we are invited by God to come to His table and to partake of the heavenly banquet. We are called to come forward like Peter, James and John to be in the presence of Christ. Perhaps when we come to this table we have an opportunity for a *theophany* or God is inviting us in order to help us see the identity of Christ more clearly. Whatever be the result, there is one thing of which we can be assured. God always calls us to join in the journey. God calls us to have '*mountain top experiences*' in our own lives. We have to keep our eyes and ears open in order to have a God experience.

A Note from Father Hendricks regarding Latin Mass

Archbishop Ranjith, when Secretary of the Congregation which oversaw the English Mass rubrics gave some speeches a few years ago in which he said that the pope wanted the Latin Mass in all parishes on Sundays. Recently a group in Poland submitted some questions to the Commission Ecclesia Dei (which watches over the Latin Mass). The Commission answered five questions submitted in German with Italian responses. No official translation into English has been published yet; only summaries of the questions and responses. The first question pertained to Sacred Triduum services, where all the parishes in a diocese have them with the Vatican II liturgy. The response stated that the pastor after a determination of the bishop can schedule both services, overturning a long-standing rule that only one liturgy is allowed each day. We will move through the list to see if Archbishop Ranjith's observation is consistent with the responses.

GOD SUPPORTS THE CALLED

Many years ago, the story goes, a mother wanted to encourage her young son's progress in learning the piano. She took him to a concert featuring the renowned Polish pianist Ignacy Jan Paderewski. Once seated, the mother spotted a friend and went over to greet her. Seizing the opportunity to explore the concert hall, the little boy wandered away from his seat, and finding a door labeled "No Admittance," he pushed it open. As the house lights dimmed, the mother returned to her seat and discovered her son was missing. Suddenly the stage curtains parted, and in the spotlights focused on the impressive Steinway on stage, the horrified mother saw the little boy sitting at the keyboard innocently picking out, note by note, "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star." At that moment, the great Paderewski made his entrance onto the stage. He quickly moved to the piano and whispered in the boy's ear, "Don't stop. Keep playing!" Leaning over, Paderewski reached down with his left hand and began filling in a bass part. He reached around to the other side of the child and he added a running obbligato with his right hand. Together, the old master and the young novice transformed an unexpected situation into a wonderfully creative experience. The audience was mesmerized. That is the way it is with God. What we can accomplish on our own is hardly worth noting. We try our best, but the results aren't exactly graceful, flowing music. Yet with the hand of the Master, our life's work truly can be beautiful. When you commit yourself to living the life of a disciple, listen carefully. You can hear the voice of the Master whispering in your ear, "Don't stop. Keep playing." Feel God's loving arms around you. Know that God's strong hands are playing the concerto of your life.
