## WEEKLY GOSPEL REFLECTIONS FROM PASTOR'S DESK

Ann Jillian, a three-time *Emmy* and *Golden Globe Award*-winning actress and singer, is an American actress born to Roman Catholic Lithuanian immigrant parents. Since 1985, she has added motivational speaking to her impressive list of credits, addressing business, medical, professional and women's groups with her own unique blend of humor and inspiration. Her prowess extends from the world's concert halls, to feature film and the Broadway stage. She has starred in over 25 TV movies, and made hundreds of other TV appearances. Her TV movie, *The Ann Jillian Story*, which recounts her victory over breast cancer, was the #1 film of the TV season, but, more important, it delivered Ann's message about the hopeful side of breast cancer to its millions of viewers. In 1985 the then 35-year-old actress made headlines when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. On her way to the hospital to check the nature of the growth which she had noticed, she stopped at St. Francis de Sales Church and read the inscription on the door. "*The same everlasting Father who cares for you today will take care of you tomorrow and every day. Either He will shield you from suffering or He will give you unflinching strength to bear it. Be at peace then and put aside all anxious thoughts and imaginations.*" She went into the church and prayed for the strength to accept her ordeal. The radiant trust in God and peace of mind she maintained before and after the surgery (double mastectomy), was big news in the media and a great inspiration for all cancer patients. She trusted in Jesus' words given in today's gospel, "*Do not be afraid; just have faith.*"

The healings in today's gospel reveal Jesus as a generous, kind and compassionate person who wills that men should live life fully. The gospel describes two of our Lord's miracles, the healing of a chronic disease and the revival of a young girl who was dead. They also give us further proof of the divine power and the infinite mercy of our Savior.

All of us, in some way or another, are constantly in need of God's healing. "Healing," "health," "wholeness," and "holiness" are linked words in English. Jesus accepts us as we are. Hence we need not wait until we have the correct motive and strong faith to bring our problems before Jesus. Let us bring before him our bodily and spiritual wounds and ask for his healing touch. We should pray for healing which will give us health in every aspect of our lives-- not just in our bodies – so that we may function in perfect harmony with people around us and with the environment.

The primary condition for the effectiveness of our prayer is our faith in the goodness and mercy of God. Such a faith is possible only if we remain related to God through prayer, the sacraments, and a meditative study of the Bible. Every day we should say a fervent prayer of thanksgiving to God for the gift of active faith. Let us keep in mind this wise piece of advice given by St. Ignatius of Loyola: "We must work as if everything depends on us, but we must pray as if everything depends on God."

**O LORD, BE MY HELP** :: Today we encounter readings that draw us into the mystery of suffering and death. In the past few years we have witnessed the devastation of life and property through tsunamis and hurricanes. So many lifted their lament to God, simply asking, "Why?" This is an honest expression of anger toward a God who we believe is the giver of life. When we lose a loved one, we can wonder why the presence of Christ is not enough to make that person rise, even from death, as did the little girl in today's Gospel passage. Again we raise our voices and ask, "Why?" At moments such as these, let us make the prayer of the psalmist our own: "Hear, O Lord, and have pity on me; O Lord, be my helper." Let us pray that our mourning will one day be turned into dancing.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION** :: As Independence Day draws near, we think of the men and women of the military who serve with courage and competence, some far from home. How does the Church accompany them? In 1939, Pope Pius XII created an independent jurisdiction of the Catholic Church called the "Military Vicariate." In 1985 Pope John Paul II created the "Archdiocese for Military Services, USA." Spanning the globe and serving nearly one and a half million Roman Catholics, more than one thousand priests minister in hospitals, on military bases of all the armed forces, on ships at sea, and on the battlefield. The AMS does not ordain priests, but accepts priests on loan from religious orders and dioceses.

In 1824 a Jesuit priest named Adam Marshall enlisted in the Navy and died at sea in 1825. He was assigned as a "schoolmaster," but he sought out and ministered to Catholic sailors. Twenty years later, President Polk was worried that the war with Mexico was seen as anti-Catholic, so he recruited two Jesuit priests to serve in the army as chaplains. At the time of the Civil War, only about ten percent of Americans were Catholic. Military policies forced Catholic soldiers to attend Protestant services. The Church protested this rule, and many priests volunteered to become chaplains. Their witness and the courage of the "Nuns of the Battlefield" (several orders of sisters who assisted Civil War victims) helped temper prejudice against Catholics and pave the way for the life and ministry of this vigorous and unique archdiocese.

#### ✝ **Open Meeting**

The meeting was opened with a prayer from Father Davis. There was one addition to the agenda, a review of the JPll Garden was added. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved as submitted. Open actions were reviewed and only one is still in progress.

#### ✝ **Old Business**

Gail Wheaton passed out information relating to the private status of the JPll garden project. There are no ties of any sort to the St. Catherine Parish. One third of the profits are donated to the Women's Council.

The parish budget for 2010 submitted by the Finance Board was reviewed. There is no increase in overall spending planned. Salaries are frozen. It was noted that the contingency (reserve) needs to be increased to be prepared for unforeseen emergencies.

Plans for the 2009 Parish Picnic were started. The preparation will begin during the summer months with a target date for the Picnic of September 27. Anthony Thomas accepted responsibility as the General Picnic Chairman. Dahlia Grajeda accepted responsibility as Mass Coordinator for the Picnic as well as Manager of the Picnic Adult and Youth Activities. Jennifer Hultgren accepted the responsibility for Purchasing needed supplies. Eloise Jones accepted the Management of Food Services.

Some activity for the formation of a blue ribbon committee to oversee a review of Parish Strategy and Ministry review has taken place. The first formal meeting of this group should be taking place in the next month.

#### ✝ **New Business**

The Outreach Ministry has evaluated the Angel Food Ministry as a tool for the parish to help parishioners. This is a non profit organization serving 35 states. It is a hand up operation that supplies food at reduced cost. This program was recommended for adoption and will be identified to parishioners shortly.

Volunteers are needed to assist with the compilation and issue of next year's Annual Parish Report. Albert Domm advised that work will begin on this in October.

Need volunteers. Claire Price and Eloise Jones volunteered to assist.

#### ✝ **Roundtable**

A draft of the Emergency Plan is being prepared for review. A special hour of prayer for those affected by the local and national economy is being planned.
