## FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

In today's readings, Jesus describes the Spirit as "another Advocate." This suggests that Jesus himself is the first helper, comforter and counselor. Everything that the Holy Spirit does is a continuation of what Jesus has begun. The Spirit spreads the truth about God, offers healing and hope, and shows the love of the Lord — just as Jesus did. "You know him," says Jesus, "because he abides with you, and he will be in you." The Spirit will actually live in us and among us, continuing the mission and ministry of Jesus.

Best of all, this Spirit will be with us forever. The death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus does not end the unscrupulous work of God. No, the Spirit proves that God has absolutely no feelings of doubt, but is sticking with his course of action. God will be with us eternally, through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. God's love never leaves.

Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit to inspire, strengthen, and defend his followers. Speaking to his disciples the night before he dies, Jesus tells them that he and his Father will send another Parakletos. The word, from kaleo (to call) and para (for, or on behalf of) designates something like an advocate, a lawyer, someone who would plead on behalf of another, who would support, advocate, and encourage.

Jesus will depart physically from the scene, but he and his Father will send their Spirit as a friend. This is the supporter, the advocate who will inspire Christians up and down the ages.

When the martyrs went to their deaths, it was with the help of the Holy Spirit; when the missionaries went to proclaim the faith in hostile lands, it was the Holy Spirit who pleaded on their behalf; when Michelangelo painted the Sistine Ceiling, it was the Holy Spirit who lifted him up; when Thomas Aquinas wrote his theological masterpieces, it was at the prompting of the Advocate.

Every now and then - maybe a handful of times over the course of a lifetime, maybe more if you are lucky - you have a day like this yourself. The bones of life poke through the fluff that otherwise preoccupies you year in, year out. You hold someone's hand as they approach death. You pick up a newborn babe. You fall in love. You are truly forgiven. Someone you love is saved from death. You marvel at the goodness of God.

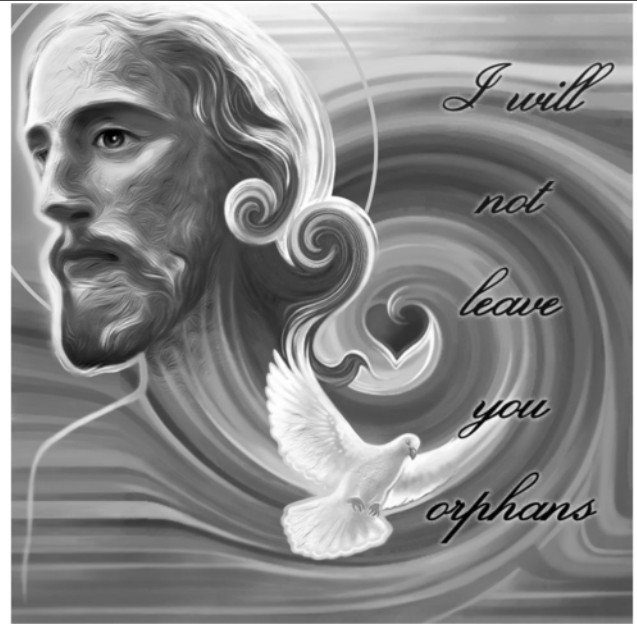
**Maybe poet William Blake put it best:**

*"And we are put on earth a little space  
That we may learn to bear the beams of love."*

In the simplest, everyday celebrations and expressions of love, God is present. The "Advocate" that Jesus promises is the Spirit of God that opens our hearts and spirits in gratitude for days like the day this family experiences and that we all experience, even if not as often as we'd like. God is in our midst in the love of a spouse holding the hand of his or her dying spouse, in the love of a new mom feeding her baby, in the love of two friends walking the beach. In the joy of the Easter season, may the Advocate enable us to "bear the beams of love" and mirror that love in our compassion and care for one another.

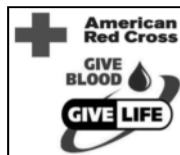
