FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

Are you in your "wedding garments" today?

This week, we hear the story of a wedding banquet. It's the invitation of a lifetime: to sit at the king's table for a royal celebration!

Whether your aim is ultimate networking, gluttonous dining, fashion ogling, or simply advertising allegiance to your king, this is the one offer you can't refuse this season. Yet many do. Folks go out of their way to rebuff the invitation with an air of self-importance. A few abuse the messengers, even to the point of death.

Having dispatched the original guest list, more servants are sent out to recruit every random citizen they can find. These, fortunately, have nothing better to do and fill the royal hall. Yet we soon learn that making an appearance isn't enough. Attendance at this affair demands real investment. One guest, at least, is banished in appalling style.

This parable is about being called and knowing how to respond. It's about responding and recognizing the gravity of what you do. Religion isn't a bill to be paid, or a game played to win a prize. Faith involves irrevocable allegiance to an ultimate authority. It's about recognizing the sacred summons when it comes and responding without hesitation, holding nothing back. Faith requires that we're serious about this, not sloppy or self-deceived about slipping one by past the Almighty. The stakes are high, and of all the aspects of our life that require a genuine personal investment, we really don't want to get this one wrong.

On one level we can think of this story as being about the afterlife our life in, with, and for God after our earthly lives have ended. But as you've heard me say a hundred times before the kingdom is something **we can embrace and enter into right now**, in this time and place. This is what has been won for us through Jesus' saving act: a newness of life, a rebirth, a transformation that allows us a **seat at the wedding feast this very day**. The party has started. And our loving God desperately wants us **to attend, to participate, to experience joy beyond our wildest imaginations**.

But God has some expectations (wedding garments) He wants us:

To **give** -even when we really don't have much.

To **be understanding** -even when we would have made other choices.

To **be hopeful** -even when times are tough, or life doesn't go as we had planned.

To **be encouraging and compassionate** -even when we'd rather simply scold or give advice.

To **be forgiving** -even when we've been hurt badly, or treated unjustly.

To **love** -even when we really don't feel like it.

These are our **wedding garments**. These are the ways we show God, and most importantly **show ourselves**, that we are **truly accepting God's invitation** and all that comes along with

it. And I'm not saying that we have to "earn" our way into the party. That's not possible. No! These God-like actions and attitudes are (in a sense) our "thank you" -our ways of **showing gratitude to a God who has loved us first**.

"How can we profess faith in God's word, and then refuse to let it inspire and direct our thinking, our activity, our decisions, and our responsibilities toward one another? Faith is always demanding, because faith leads us beyond ourselves." (Saint Pope John Paul II)
