FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

Rockefeller started giving to God His due and lived: That was a lesson learned by John D. Rockefeller, Sr. He drove himself hard to be a success. He became a millionaire by this age of twenty-three and by the age of fifty was the richest man on earth. Then at fifty-three years of age, Rockefeller developed a serious illness which caused the hair on his head, his eyebrows, and eyelashes to drop off. Even though he was the world's only billionaire and could have almost anything on earth he wanted, he could only digest milk and crackers. He became shrunken like a mummy. He could not sleep, would not smile, and nothing in life meant much to him at all. Doctors predicted that within a year he would be dead. One night, however, as Rockefeller struggled to fall asleep he came to grips with his life. He realized that he could take nothing with him into the next world. The next day he embarked on a new way of living. Rather than hoarding his money and possessions, he began to give them away to persons in need. Establishing the Rockefeller Foundation, he channeled his fortune into hospitals, research, and mission work. His contributions eventually led to the discovery of penicillin as well as cures for malaria, tuberculosis, and diphtheria. At age 53, Rockefeller was given a year to live. **By learning to live by the principle of giving rather than getting, he altered his life so dramatically that he eventually lived to the ripe old age of ninety-eight!**

Today is World Mission Sunday—a title that may suggest it's time to sit back and tune out. Missionary work, after all, isn't about us. **It's about rare characters running around in jungles spooning out rice and saying Mass in straw huts. But Pope Francis says the church is "missionary by nature." We're that church. Which means you and I are missionaries to the core.**

The pope offers three questions that are at the heart of our Christian identity. As believers, **what's the basis of our mission? What's at the center of our life as church? What fundamental approaches assist us in carrying out our mission?** Being Pope, Francis also supplies answers for our reflection. **The basis of our mission is Transformation. We become church to be transformed by our relationship to Jesus. In turn, we set out to transform the world with this same vital encounter.**

If the mission is transformation, **how does the church foster this? Three ways: in its worship, in the encouragement to a Spirit-filled life, and in preaching the gospel passionately and creatively. Remember, the gospel's a Person, not a creed or theology.** We preach Jesus therefore by way of sacraments, acts of service, and sacrifices of our resources. We introduce the world to Jesus by doing what Jesus did and still does—through us.

What about that final question: **How do we approach our mission? Pope Francis insists it's not about force-feeding the world our ideology or ethical teaching. Jesus isn't Aristotle, and he isn't Moses. Jesus is the first**

great evangelizer, the bearer of GOOD NEWS. Which makes our goal to evangelize and to act: to bring good news and then to demonstrate how good it really is. This mission **puts all of us in constant Exodus mode, according to the pope. We can't hunker down into our comfort zones and relax. Missionaries are apostles: They're sent, which means primarily they move. The church isn't an end in itself, as our restless young people have been telling us by refusing to park in the pews. The Gospel is a Person, and he's already down the road ahead of us.**
