## FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

### FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

I have officiated a lot of funerals. It is the nature of my work as a pastor. Many of our funerals, a family member will give a eulogy about the one who has died. As I listened to these eulogies, I am moved and inspired. And I find myself wondering: What would they say about me? Will anyone say I was a priest? A good person? Have I been kind and generous? Have I been a vessel of God's love? Have I cared for the least among us? Have I done enough to be welcomed home? When that day comes, will I be among the sheep or the goats?

Think of these statements by the King who permits entry to Eternal Kingdom!

I was hungry, and you fed me,  
I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink,  
I was homeless, and you gave me a room,  
I was shivering, and you gave me clothes,  
I was sick, and you stopped to visit,  
I was in prison and you came to me.'

NOTHING MORE!

"Isn't this salvation by works instead of salvation by faith?" we might ask. James, the brother of Jesus, also encouraged us to "be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves." James also said, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world."

About faith and works, James wrote, "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith."

On the feast of Christ the King, we acknowledge the supremacy of one Son of God who is head over this Body, the church. We bow before one Lord and confess him as the ultimate ruler over truth and guide over human history. We accept that Christ alone shows us the way of life and all other routes will prove futile and frustrating. If we want to inherit the Kingdom prepared for us since the dawn of time, the instructions are absurdly simple:

Take care of one other. Love your neighbor. In doing so we participate in the love of God. If we learn nothing else from reading the Bible, this instruction would be enough to hold us in life everlasting.

Jesus shares the life of the poor, from the cradle to the cross; he experiences hunger, thirst, and privation. Jesus identifies himself with the poor of every kind and makes active love toward them the condition for entering the Kingdom. - Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 544)

On the weekend of **Dec. 2nd – 3rd** Khader & Mary Abu Sada, a Catholic couple from the **Holy Land**, will be visiting our parish to market olive wood hand carved religious articles made by the Christian artisans in the Holy Land.

With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and due to the lack of Christian pilgrims, the outlets for the olive wood hand carvings have been closed, leading unemployment to increase up to 75%, forcing many Christians to leave the Holy Land in order to find other ways to market their handiwork. The absence of a living Christian community is very disastrous for the Holy sites, such as the **Church of Nativity** and the **Church of the Holy Sepulcher**.

This sale is to strengthen the Christian presence in the city of **Bethlehem**, the birthplace of **Jesus**, and the surrounding areas. All proceeds will go directly to the Christian families and the artisans who are working in this type of hand carvings.

They are going to display all kinds of olive wood religious art works such as:

Nativity scenes, Crucifixes, figures, rosaries, etc... which are unique and not usually found in religious stores. These crafts make wonderful presents for all occasions especially for Christmas. Their price range is from \$8.00 to \$700.00. Checks and credit card are welcome.

Please take the opportunity on **Dec 2nd – 3rd** to check out these unique crafts and hopefully you would be able to assist our brothers and sisters in the Land of Jesus by purchasing some of these religious goods. Buying one piece will help prevent Christians from leaving the Holy Land.
